Spotlight on Kean University President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. '00

In his inaugural address, President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D., vowed to foster an environment where students “keep climbing higher.” During the last year, Kean’s 18th leader proved himself an exemplar of that mission in his actions and achievements.

With a focus on safety, academic excellence and equity, Repollet has guided the institution toward a number of esteemed accomplishments. He actively seeks ways to elevate diversity and promote inclusivity and belonging within the Kean community, and elevate the University’s status as a research institution.

Among the recent laudable achievements is Kean’s upgraded status as a professional/doctoral university according to the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education. The designation brings the University one step closer to becoming an R2 Research University under the Carnegie classification. Kean offers seven doctoral programs and awarded 54 doctorates in 2021.

A recent bill signed by New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy designates Kean as the state’s only urban research university. This status will help to make a real difference in urban communities while helping to build stronger futures for urban centers.

“This designation is a transformative development for Kean and positions the university as a statewide leader in research and policy for our underserved cities and urban communities,” Repollet said.

The first Black president of the University, Repollet was appointed to the African American Chamber of Commerce of New Jersey Foundation Board of Directors, which provides a platform for the state’s African American business leaders to speak with a collective voice. The Chamber advocates and promotes economic diversity and fosters a climate of business growth through major initiatives centering on education and public policy.

Repollet has already made progress in those efforts. He shared his views on faculty diversification in *Diverse: Issues in Higher Education*, emphasizing how society can reach a common understanding of shared history by engaging diverse perspectives.

“Universities like Kean have a crucial role to play in helping us see our history from all perspectives,” he wrote. “We need to examine both the soaring heights as well as the darkest recesses of our history and engage in meaningful conversation about current challenges we face as a society.”

But even amid Repollet’s many successes, opportunities abound for the Kean community to transform and excel. Repollet was among several leaders of New Jersey universities to share wisdom with Capital Analytics Associates on the current challenges facing institutions of higher education.

“With Kean University, we have to bridge the gap and create partnerships to better serve our students and community,” Repollet said. “We’ll be able to collaborate, to take steps toward an action plan that serves the regional economies of the state — South Jersey, Central Jersey and North Jersey.”

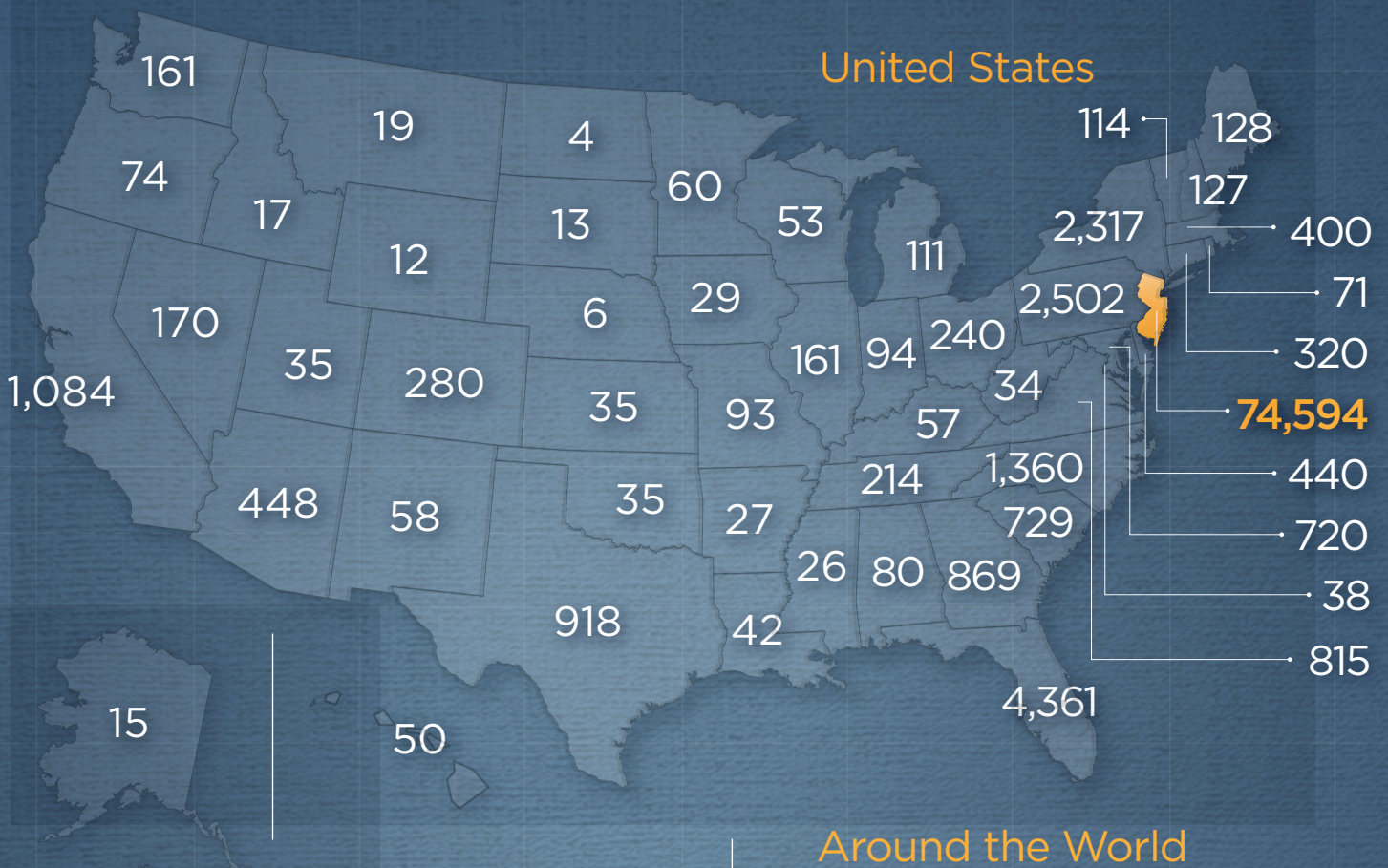

The New York Jets are Ready to Play Ball in Education Partnership

Kean University is teaming up with the New York Jets to create academic and career opportunities, becoming an Official Education Partner of the NFL team.

The Jets and the University announced the new partnership, which includes a multi-faceted educational program for Kean students, featuring a new Jets-centric course to be offered at Kean. Students and alumni will also have access to internships and jobs with the NFL franchise.

"I am thrilled to announce that Kean University has signed on to become an Official Education Partner of the New York Jets," said President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. "This connection offers wonderful opportunities for our students to study the business of professional sports, to conduct research, and to obtain internships and other professional opportunities that can lead to truly exciting futures."

"The New York Jets organization is excited to partner with Kean University and further our support and involvement within the education system," said Hymie Elhai, New York Jets president. "Both Kean and the Jets are dedicated to providing students with unique opportunities and resources to further the development of future sports industry executives."

A lifelong football fan, Repollet said the partnership gives Kean an immediate connection to the Jets team and the NFL. The partnership also provides Kean with new marketing opportunities.

"The NFL is the best-known sports league in the United States, and the New York Jets, who play at MetLife Stadium in New Jersey, are a team with a long history and an exciting future," he said. "We could not be more pleased to be able to share in the prestige and the excitement of the world-class NFL."

Hennings College of Science, Math and Technology Dedicated in Honor of Educators

Kean University held a ribbon-cutting ceremony to officially dedicate The Dorothy and George Hennings College of Science, Mathematics and Technology, and honor Distinguished Professor Emerita Dorothy Grant Hennings, Ed.D., and her husband, the late Professor George Hennings, Ed.D. Dr. Dorothy Hennings made a historic gift to Kean University last year.

The event, held in a sunny courtyard near the college bearing their names, also marked the release of Dr. Dorothy Hennings' book, *Wandering the World with George*. The heartfelt memoir, which she wrote during the COVID-19 pandemic, recounts the devoted couple's life and 48 years of world travels together. It is available for purchase through Kean's Office of University Relations for a nominal donation which will directly support the Kean University Foundation.

"Your generous gift to this University serves as a lifelong lesson to all of us. You have helped students far beyond your classrooms," Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D., said, noting the couple's passion for living and adventure chronicled in the book. "You and George are prime examples of what we mean when we say 'Cougars Climb Higher.'"

The couple met at Kean in 1965, married in 1968 and taught at the University for a combined 63 years. In May 2020, Dr. Dorothy Hennings, a former professor in the College of Education, made the largest philanthropic gift in Kean University history when she funded a scholarship named for her husband, a biology professor.

The gift supports scholarships for students in science and science education, as well as low-income, high-achieving students through Kean's Centennial Fund Opportunity Scholarships.

In grateful recognition, Kean's Board of Trustees named The Dorothy and George Hennings College of Science, Mathematics and Technology for the couple. Kean's science building was named George Hennings Hall; the education building, Dorothy Grant Hennings Hall; and a connecting hallway between the two was named Dorothy and George Way. A new science research lab addition was named George Hennings Research Wing.

Dorothy Hennings, who was awarded an honorary degree from Kean in 2010 with her husband, received a standing ovation at the ceremony, and read a poem she wrote dedicated to him. "My husband loved the Earth," she said. "He stood in awe before the universe."

The Hennings were passionate about education and travel—and combined both in journeys to Antarctica, the Amazon and a total of 187 countries and territories across the globe.

"For nearly 50 years, we traveled the world by ship, plane, car and bus. We walked the streets of some of the greatest and most beautiful cities on Earth. Travel was a major part of our life," Dorothy wrote in the book, which was published by Kean University Press.

President Biden Nominates Kean University VP to Foundation Board

President Biden nominated Barbara George Johnson, vice president of external affairs and urban policy and research at Kean University, as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Barry Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Foundation.

The nomination affirms Kean’s commitment to research as the university pursues a Carnegie R2 research designation.

The foundation, established by Congress in 1986 to honor the late U.S. senator and statesman Barry Goldwater, provides scholarships to college sophomores and juniors to pursue research careers in the natural sciences, mathematics and engineering.

From an estimated pool of over 5,000 college sophomores and juniors, 1,256 natural science, engineering and mathematics students were nominated by 438 academic institutions. Goldwater scholarships were awarded to 409 college students from across the United States for the 2021–2022 academic year.

“I am excited and honored to be named to this prestigious national board in higher education,” Johnson said. “Particularly within the STEM fields, it’s important to ensure that we are supporting young scholars from all walks of life and offering opportunities that expand innovation in our country through their experiences, vision and research.”

Johnson has more than 30 years of experience as a public policy professional in New Jersey and has shaped economic, health and social policy in the state.

At the John S. Watson Institute for Public Policy, she oversees the work and mission of the New Jersey Urban Mayors Association, a one-of-a-kind organization of 32 mayors engaged in collective policymaking. The institute focuses on urban environmental policy, public health policy, early childhood policy, and instruction in leadership development and civic engagement.

“Barbara George Johnson’s nomination to the Goldwater Foundation puts Kean on the national stage as the University works toward its goal of becoming a Carnegie R2 research institution,” said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. “The foundation’s board will benefit from Barbara’s experience and expertise and her focus on bringing equity into the STEM fields so that the U.S. can continue to bring innovation into the world.”

Johnson has an extensive background in health care, public health and public policy. Early in her career, she spearheaded the development of the Newark Kids Initiative for the Newark Health Department, which focused on healthcare and social services for children affected by domestic violence. She also served on the CDC-funded Newark Prevention Marketing Initiative and other task forces on HIV/AIDS.

National Leadership Academy Selects Two Kean Administrators

The Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities has selected two Kean University administrators as members of its Leadership Academy/*La Academia de Liderazgo* this fall.

Kean Associate Vice President of Student Success and Retention Carlos E. Rodriguez and Senior Director of Admissions Carlos L. Nazario were each named to the third cohort of the program.

“These two talented leaders, Carlos Rodriguez and Carlos Nazario, are instrumental in advancing Kean’s student-focused approach to higher education,” said Kean University President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. “I congratulate them on their selection to this prestigious academy and look forward to the innovations they will bring back to Kean from their Leadership Academy experience.”

Kean, a historically inclusive university, offers numerous programs to support its diverse student body, including many scholarship opportunities. *U.S. News & World Report* recognized Kean as a leader in social mobility for helping economically disadvantaged students succeed and graduate.

The Leadership Academy works with leaders at existing and emerging Hispanic-Serving Institutions. Fellows attend conferences and are mentored by senior-level administrators from numerous universities, and each fellow develops a project designed to impact their home institution.

Rodriguez said being selected is among his proudest professional achievements.

“The one-year program will allow me to learn from a network of advocates who focus on student success at Hispanic-Serving Institutions,” he said. “Like Kean University, HACU is renowned for promoting cultural diversity, and I see great symmetry between that work and President Repollet’s vision to provide our Kean students with a world-class education.”

Nazario said he was “humbled and thankful” to be chosen. “I will be joining a distinguished group of individuals who have dedicated their lives to making higher education accessible to so many underrepresented communities,” he said.

Based in San Antonio, the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities is the only national association representing existing and emerging Hispanic-Serving Institutions. The Leadership Academy is a direct response to the declining rate of Hispanic university presidents, despite the unprecedented growth of U.S. Hispanic college student enrollment, according to the association’s website.





Institute for Life Science Entrepreneurship Receives Federal Prize to Support Inclusivity

The Institute for Life Science Entrepreneurship (ILSE) at Kean University has received a U.S. Small Business Administration award to spur investment in underrepresented communities within the innovation economy and encourage diversity and inclusion in entrepreneurship.

ILSE, a life-science technology accelerator based at Kean's STEM Building, received one of 84 prizes nationwide in the 2021 Growth Accelerator Fund Competition. Each prize is \$50,000.

"Equity and opportunity for all are core principles at Kean University, so this award for ILSE is very gratifying," said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. "We will continue to work with ILSE and throughout the University to make the STEM fields more inclusive and give our diverse students and graduates the chance to bring their unique approaches and ideas to the marketplace."

In addition to supporting the growth and development of life science startups, ILSE is also a business incubator and science-driven research institute that works in partnership with innovators and affiliated academic and biomedical institutions.

"We are delighted to be recognized by the Small Business Administration for the work we do in support of entrepreneurship," said Thomas Richardson, Ph.D., ILSE president. "Promoting diversity in life sciences is important to the quality of startups developing healthcare technologies in countless areas that help all of us. We are proud of those we have worked with on startups and in our programming and look forward to more to come."

Over the past three years, ILSE has supported more than 200 entrepreneurs from academia and industry from all over the world through consulting on startup potential for various therapeutic, diagnostics and

medical device technologies. Since ILSE's inception and through its Biotech Launchpad, a comprehensive suite of business and scientific services to support the commercial success of life science startups, ILSE has helped more than 18 very early-stage companies and technologies raise more than \$17 million in startup funds. Further, as part of the New Jersey Academic Drug Discovery Consortium comprising higher education research universities and institutions in New Jersey, ILSE has played an active role in event programming to support networking and connections to scientific teams and technologies.

Kean University Senior VP Awarded Top Science Research Honor

Kean University Senior Vice President for Research, Jeffrey H. Toney, Ph.D., has been named a fellow of Sigma Xi, the prestigious Scientific Research Honor Society. Toney, who is also a visiting professor at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, is one of 15 members selected for the 2021 cohort for “exceptional contributions” to society and scientific enterprise. Members are nominated by leaders of Sigma Xi and are selected on a competitive basis.

Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D., congratulated Toney, who works to lead and create research programs across the University. “Research has always been a point of pride at Kean, and we are grateful

to Dr. Toney for his dedication to fostering both faculty and student research,” Repollet said.

Toney comes to the honor with a lifetime of experience in research. He began while working as a volunteer at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Md., while still in high school.

“As the first in my family to attend college, my family questioned why I would consider working for free,” he said. “Now they understand.”

Kean Wins Two National Science Foundation Grants to Support Diversity in Computer Science

Kean University is leading a five-school consortium that received a \$5 million research grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF) to increase the number of high-achieving minority students entering the fields of cybersecurity and data science.

In a separate, second announcement from NSF, Kean will also share in a \$2.9 million grant supporting and encouraging students, especially minorities and women, to pursue doctoral degrees in the computing sciences at major research universities, designated as R1 institutions.



“Kean University is thrilled to receive these awards from the National Science Foundation supporting diverse students at the undergraduate and graduate levels in computer science and cybersecurity,” said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D.

The \$5 million NSF grant will contribute to the “national need for well-educated scientists, mathematicians, engineers and technicians” by supporting the retention and graduation of high-achieving, low-income students, according to the award description. A goal is also to build regional workforce strength in cybersecurity and data science. Of the total funding, \$1.6 million is earmarked for Kean.



Kean Building and Students Receive Awards in Architecture

The Kean Skylands “classroom in the trees” received top design honors, and three Kean student architects won awards for their work from the American Institute of Architects Newark + Suburban Chapter (AIANS).

The Skylands academic building known as “The Cabin” won the organization’s 2021 Gold Award for its environmental design that, according to the project’s description, “treads lightly on the land.” The building was designed by NK Architects of Morristown, who also designed Kean’s Hynes Hall and Liberty Hall Academic Center.

In addition, the top AIANS student prize and another award went to undergraduate architecture students from Kean’s Michael Graves College.

Senior architecture majors Vitor Costa, of Roselle Park, and Jeter Vasquez, of Roselle, won first place for “La Nebulosa,” an adaptive reuse design that reinvents Ex Filanda, a historic building in Rome, to create dormitories for students.

A student merit award also went to junior Khalif Dowdy of Scotch Plains for his project redesigning the Park Avenue Armory in New York City. His design creates a skyscraper using sustainable techniques to build affordable housing, while also engaging people with nature.

Kean Leads Restorative Justice Training Program

Kean University has launched a Restorative Justice in Education pilot program to create a more supportive and inclusive culture in K–12 schools. Supported by a New Jersey Department of Education (DOE) grant, Kean facilitators are training educators across 15 New Jersey school districts in restorative justice, a practice that replaces traditional forms of discipline with methods designed to embrace equity and build community in the classroom.

“This program can have a significant impact on the lives of students throughout New Jersey as we support teachers in developing equitable disciplinary practices in their classrooms,” said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. “We are proud to help schools transition to a restorative justice approach, and we are grateful for the opportunity to share our expertise with the K–12 education community.”

Restorative justice has a foundation in racial and social justice. It works to replace traditional forms of discipline such as suspensions, which disproportionately affect minority students, with other methods such as student court, conferencing, restorative circles and mediation.

Kean facilitators are training educators across 15 New Jersey school districts in restorative justice, a practice that replaces traditional forms of discipline with methods designed to embrace equity and build community in the classroom.

Kean Athletic Training Student Wins NFL Scholarship

A Kean University athletic training student doing her clinical rotation with the New York Jets has received a scholarship designed to encourage female and minority students to pursue a National Football League career. The award from the NFL and the Professional Football Athletic Trainers Society was given to senior Tianna Marquez, who is from Paterson.

“Being able to do my clinical rotation with a professional NFL team is a dream come true,” Marquez said, adding that she was “surprised and honored” when the Jets’ head trainer presented her with the scholarship. Kean’s athletic training program has placed clinical interns with the Jets for six years. Kean also recently entered into a new academic partnership with the football team.

“We are grateful to the NFL and the Jets for continuing to lift up and support Kean University, this time with a scholarship for one of our outstanding athletic training students,” said Kean President Lamont O. Boss interned last summer on the Rally for Barnegat Bay, a three-year project that recruits volunteer citizen scientists to test the water along the Bay. The goal is to find and eliminate sources of pathogen contaminants, which largely come from human and animal waste.

Boss produced web content for the Rally for Barnegat Bay, created a presentation to educate and raise awareness at a Rally Open House, created a social media campaign, took part in a podcast and contributed to a state Department of Environmental Protection grant application.

Kean Designated Cybersecurity Center of Excellence

Kean University has been designated as a National Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense (CAE-CD) by the National Security Agency for its academic programs and practices to address a growing national crisis—the shortage of trained cybersecurity professionals in the workforce.

This prestigious designation will allow Kean’s faculty and students to apply for additional research grants and scholarships from the U.S. Department of Defense, National Science Foundation, National Security Agency and other agencies and organizations, and collaborate with other centers of excellence.

“Higher education plays a critical role in defending America’s cyberspace, and Kean University is helping to meet that challenge,” said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. “Being designated as a Center of Academic Excellence in Cyber Defense demonstrates that Kean graduates are prepared to meet the need for trained cybersecurity professionals, which is vital to the region and our nation.”

Kean’s NSA CAE-CD designation initiative was led by Stan Mierzwa, managing assistant director and lecturer at Kean’s Center for Cybersecurity, with Associate Professor Jing-Chiou Liou, Ph.D., serving as the academic point-of-contact for the cybersecurity curriculum.

Donor Spotlight

Arthur F. '68 '73 and Beverly '68 Kirk

After retiring from an impactful and stellar career as a college president at two institutions, Arthur "Artie" Kirk Jr., '68 '73 suffered a series of three debilitating strokes. He was told he would not regain his ability to read or write, or even walk and talk. He took it as a personal challenge. With the ever-present assistance, encouragement, love and support of his wife, Beverly Centrella '73 Kirk, Artie regained his abilities—and went on to author and publish his memoir. A testament to the couple's devotion, it was one of many significant accomplishments the Kirks have shared as extraordinary examples of Cougars who climb higher, together.

As a teenager growing up in Linden, New Jersey, Artie had little idea how some sisterly advice would change the course of his life. Beverly, who grew up in Hoboken, New Jersey, was equally unaware of how being waitlisted by (then) Jersey City State College would change the course of her life, as well. Artie was accepted into Lehigh University, located in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Despite receiving a partial scholarship, however, attending Lehigh remained unattainable given his family's financial circumstances. In 1964, instead of pursuing college, Artie made the decision to enlist in the United States Marine Corps.—just as the war in Vietnam was gaining momentum. A mere two weeks before Artie was scheduled to be inducted, fate intervened in the form of his sister, Jacquelin Kirk '66 Coccozza, and he made the decision to forego the military and enroll in Newark State College, now Kean University.

It was not until shortly after they had both graduated in 1968 that, during a trip to the beach in Long Branch, New Jersey, Artie finally realized that Beverly was the only girl for him. They were married a year later on August 3, 1969.

Beverly's path to Newark State proved less complicated than Artie's. Upon notice of being waitlisted by Jersey City State, Beverly opted to attend Newark State following fortuitous words of encouragement from her mother, who stated, "That is where you will meet your husband."

Though Artie initially intended to focus on English studies while at Newark State, he ultimately graduated in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts in history, thus setting him on a path to eventually teach the subject. Beverly graduated the same year with a degree in elementary education.

Artie was active within the student community while attending Newark State, both as a member of the Sigma Beta Tau fraternity, as well as editor of the student newspaper. Beverly, a member of the Beta Delta Chi sorority, had taken on a typist position in the college's public relations department via a work-study program—which is where she and Artie crossed paths. Artie had visited the public relations office in need of a typist to assist him with a newspaper article, and Beverly was happy to oblige. The pair crossed paths, once again, during their junior years while their fraternity and sorority were visiting Florida for spring break. Artie recalls Beverly made quite the impression; alas, at that moment in time, Artie was unavailable to pursue a relationship. In fact, it was not until shortly after they had both graduated in 1968 that, during a trip to the

beach in Long Branch, New Jersey, Artie finally realized that Beverly was the only girl for him. They were married a year later on August 3, 1969.

Following their respective graduations, Beverly began teaching kindergarten in Newark, while Artie took on a history teacher role at a middle school located in Linden. Artie went on to earn not only a Master of Arts degree in education administration and supervision from Kean College, but also a Doctor of Education degree from Rutgers University in 1983. While pursuing his advanced degrees, Artie served as executive vice president and chief financial officer of Misericordia University, a liberal arts college located in Dallas, Pennsylvania. During his four-and-a-half-year tenure, he was instrumental in the school's transformational turnaround, reversing years of decline and putting the institution on a path to sustainable prosperity. From Misericordia, Artie assumed the role of President at Keuka College, New York, before moving on to Saint Leo University, Florida.

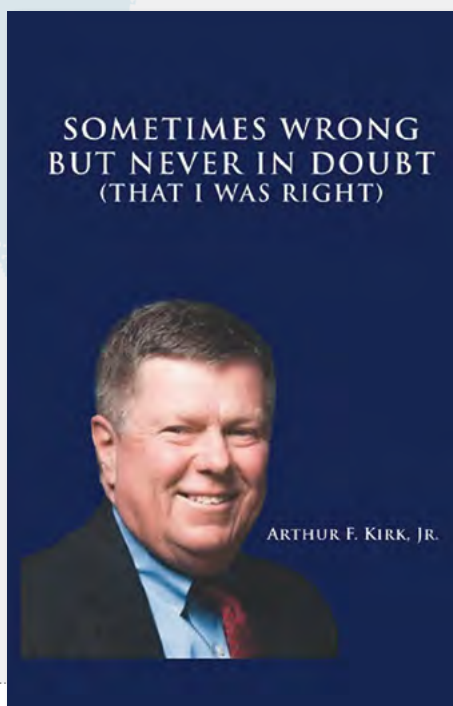
During his more than 18 years at the helm, Saint Leo University grew from a small campus of 730 students with a total student population of 7,100, most of whom resided on 15 military bases, to a thriving campus of over 2,300 students with a total student population exceeding 16,500. Artie is responsible for building one of the largest and most respected online education programs among private, nonprofit colleges in the United States. As part of that growth, Saint Leo University became the third largest Catholic University in the nation. Under his leadership, Saint Leo's annual revenue grew from \$26 million in 1997 to over \$170 million in 2015, and net assets grew from \$19 million to over \$175 million. The University's endowment increased more than tenfold, and the combination of endowment and cash reserves exceeded \$100 million at the time of Artie's retirement—up from \$6 million in 1997. Artie retired from the presidency of Saint Leo University in the summer of 2015.

In total, Artie spent 31 years as president of a college or university. While he was busy advancing his career and leading institutions of higher education, Beverly was busy raising the couple's two children, Arthur III and Whitney. She eventually resumed her teaching career in New York and Florida, respectively.

Earlier in his career, Artie had served as the first full-time director of Kean's alumni office. It was during that time, as well as his previous volunteer service as president of the Kean University Alumni Association, that both he and Beverly embraced the spirit and importance of giving back. Since then, the pair of alumni have always remembered and honored the significance of Kean in their lives. They have generously supported the Foundation's Sigma Beta Tau Endowed Scholarship, the Centennial Fund and the Kean Fund for Excellence.

Most recently, they have honored Kean by contributing the proceeds of Art's memoir in support of the Kean University Foundation's mission. The Foundation is grateful for this particularly inspiring gift.

Arthur's memoir, *Sometimes Wrong but Never in Doubt (that I was right)*, is available through Amazon. It is highly recommend reading for all Cougars.

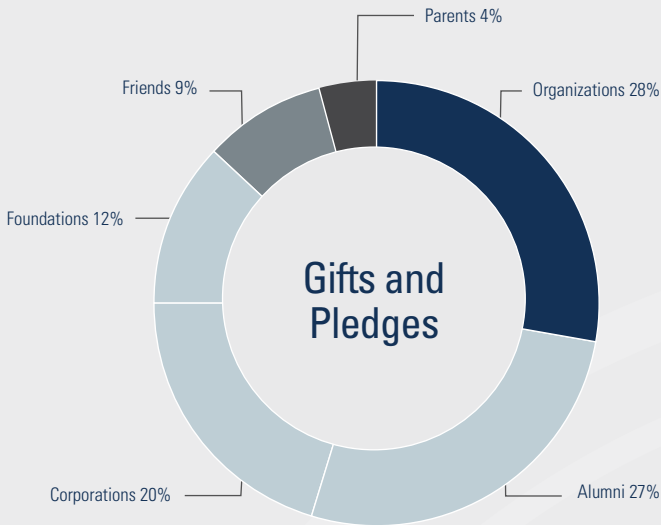

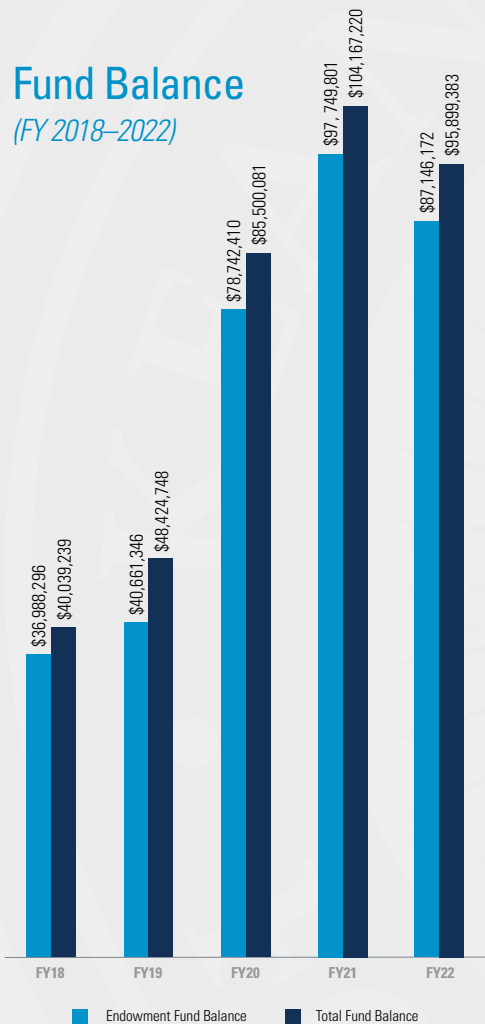

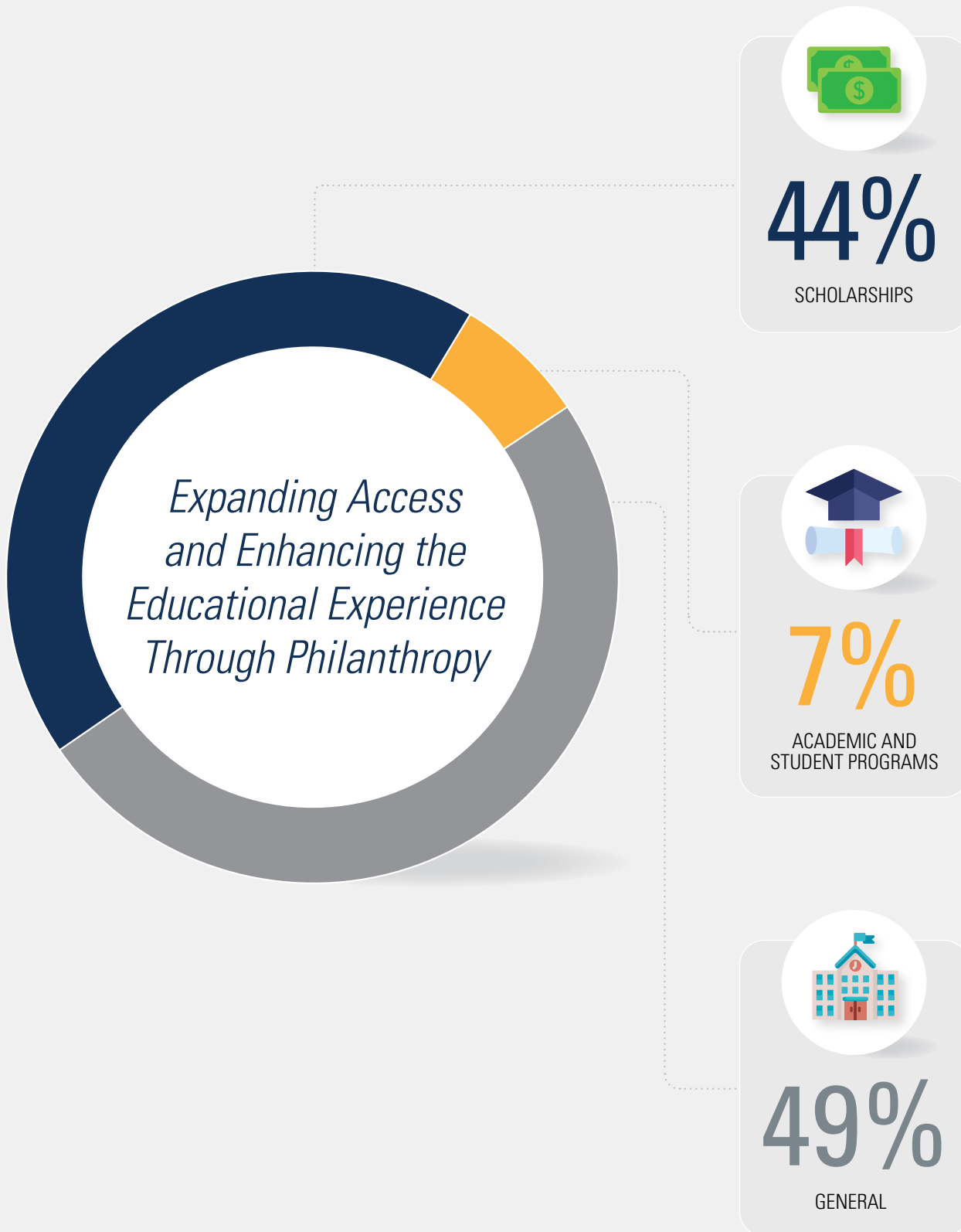
